





Halloween Safety Tips

Ivins Public Safety Department

In preparation for the upcoming Halloween season, the Ivins City Public Safety Department has some safety tips for your family.

- Plan your trick-or-treat route ahead of time. Pick streets you know and that are well lit.
- Take a parent or an older sister or brother with you when you go trick-or-treating. If someone older cannot go, then go with a group.
- Trick-or-treat when it is still light outside.
- Wear a costume that makes it easy for you to walk and that can be seen after dark.
- Carry a flashlight and use reflective tape on your costumes so people driving cars can see you.
- If possible, wear make-up instead of a mask. If you wear a mask, take it off before crossing streets.
- Cross only at corners, never cross the street between parked cars or in the middle of a busy block.
- If there are no sidewalks, walk facing oncoming traffic to make sure you can see cars.
- Do not eat your candy until you get home and have an adult check it to make sure it's safe.

We know your child's safety is a top priority for you. That's why we're inviting you to join us for **International Walk to School Day on October 6, 2010**.



Red Mountain Elementary and Washington County Safe Kids are partnering with program sponsor FedEx to make this important pedestrian safety event possible.

We need your involvement! Please:

- Participate in International Walk to School Day on Wednesday, October 6, by walking your child(ren) to school. If you can't walk with your child, ask a family member or friend to participate in your place.
- While walking that day, talk to your child about pedestrian safety messages below.
- Take note of any pedestrian hazards (no sidewalks, no crosswalk, etc.) along the route your child takes to school.

The long-term goal of Safe Kids Walk This Way is to increase walking and make neighborhoods safer for walking to school. We encourage you to become involved in this program! In the meantime, here are some helpful tips for walking safely with your child:

- Recommend that children under age 10 not cross streets alone. Children need to be old enough to develop the skills to cross streets safely.
- Always model and teach proper pedestrian behavior.
- Instruct children to look left, right and left again when crossing streets and to continue looking as they cross.
- Make sure children don't run into streets or dart from between parked cars.
- Require children to wear retro reflective materials and carry a flashlight at dawn, at dusk and in bad weather.

The Last Hurdle

Shortly after taking office I proposed a fresh approach to completing the road and sidewalk improvements in our Historic Township. We've discussed it at length, moved forward with the planning, successfully applied for the necessary bonding, proposed a Special Area Assessment (SAA) for the Historic Township residents, notified the impacted property owners of their proposed assessments, completed the required protest period with 70% approval, held the necessary public hearing and formally established the SAA. Only one more hurdle remains, the needed \$1.5 million dollars in Federal funding.

I have had productive discussions with Senator Bennett and Congressman Matheson and our staff has been in regular contact with their staff. We've had the funding coordinators for both Senator Hatch and Congressman Matheson come to Ivins, tour the project area and commit their best effort in our behalf. The reality is that now is a difficult time to obtain Federal funding except for targeted stimulus projects. The country is concerned about excessive Federal spending and a growing deficit so earmarks and appropriations are not popular this election year.

So making it over this last hurdle won't be easy and will require your help. Congressional Staff we've met with reminded us that letters and e-mails to our elected officials will make a difference. Expressions of public support for a project like ours significantly increase the likelihood that it will be funded. Recognizing that, I'm asking you to take the time to write or e-mail both of our Senators and Congressman Matheson on our behalf. Their contact information is provided below.

Some important points to be emphasized are as follows: First, this project is a major step towards our compliance with EPA storm water requirements. Second, it solves flooding problems for a number of our residents. Third, it dramatically improves pedestrian safety particularly for our school children. Fourth, Ivins City as a whole and the residents of the Historic Township are at great sacrifice providing 70% of the financing for this project. It is doubtful that many if any of the other projects currently under their consideration have nearly that level of local participation. Fifth, other than a small CDBG grant, Ivins City has not received Federal assistance for a project since the dike at the base of the red mountain was built thirty three years ago. It's our turn. And last but not least, the project is "shovel ready" and could commence immediately providing many needed jobs to area residents.

I am prepared to fly to Washington D.C. and lobby in person for this important project to be funded, but any effort on my part will pale in comparison to your involvement. Imagine the impact of a thousand letters and e-mails from a City our size in support of this much needed project that solves some basic and long standing problems for our residents. I ask that each of you take the time to write our elected officials expressing your support for the project and your appreciation for their putting in

place the last puzzle part for it to become a reality. I assure you that you will improve our odds for success. I firmly believe that with your help we can and will clear this last hurdle. Thank you.

The Pet Corner

This month Animal Control and FIAS are concerned about the same issue, feral cats and feline family pets. As a responsible pet owner, whether feline or canine, there are certain responsibilities you are expected to fulfill. A pet owner must provide a safe environment for the pet and cannot let the pet impede on neighbors property making it a play area and dumping station. Ivins is a pet friendly community but the pet owner must be a community friendly pet owner.

The shelter has been overwhelmed with feral and family cats. FIAS has been overwhelmed with veterinary bills because of sick and injured cats, spay/neuter expense and litter expense. The feline population is a direct result of family pets being turned outside and constantly breeding with feral cats. The shelter receives numerous complaint calls regarding a neighborhood cat killing the birds or causing other types of distress. Canine and feline pet owners may have their pets impounded when nuisance complaints are reported. There is an impound fee to claim your pet and depending on the circumstance a citation may be issued.

We are asking for your help in addressing the cat situation. Please share your opinion regarding this issue and offer suggestions on how Animal Control and FIAS can work together to help solve the problem. All of your input will be compiled, reviewed and shared with the community. You may send your thoughts and ideas by emailing Aggie at asmith@ivins.com, FIAS at lindafias@msn.com or you may drop a note off at the Police Station. We value your input and want to work with you to improve our community.

Smoke Detectors

Smoke detectors save lives, but they only save lives if they are kept in working condition. To keep your detectors working your fire department recommends the following:

Test them. Manufacturers recommend that smoke detectors be tested on a monthly basis to insure they are working. On the face of the detector there is a test button. To test your detectors press and hold the button until the detector sounds an alarm. If your detectors are interconnected they should all sound together when one is activated.

Change your batteries. Most detectors today are equipped with a 9-volt battery. Even if your detectors are connected to a 120 volt electrical circuit in your home, they likely have a battery as a back-up source of power in case your electricity goes off. Your smoke detector batteries should be replaced at least once a year. Smoke detectors are generally located near or on the ceiling which makes them difficult to reach. If you need help to change the batteries please contact the Ivins City Fire Department to help. They can be reached at (435) 674-1083. You must supply the batteries.

Clean Them. Detectors can accumulate dust in them which sometimes results in them going off when no fire is present. It is a good idea to clean them at least once a year or after you have remodeled or done anything which generates a lot of dust. You can use a can of dry compressed air to remove dust to keep them working properly.

Replace them. Smoke detectors last from 8 to 10 years. Some may last longer but it is a good rule of thumb to change them every 10 years or anytime they don't function properly.

Burn Season Open

The fall burn window will be open from October 1 through October 31, 2010. Burn windows are specific periods identified by State and Federal regulations where the burning of weeds and other agricultural debris is allowed. Burn windows are established to address fire safety and environmental concerns and correspond with normal yearly weather patterns. With the opening of the fall burn season, you are welcome to use burning as a means of facilitating the cleanup of your properties. In order to burn within the city you need to obtain a burn permit. Permits are no cost and can be obtained over the Internet. To obtain a burn permit go to www.sgcity.org/police and click on the County Burn Permit icon on the right side of the page, fill out the on-line permit and follow the instructions. If you do not have access to the Internet, contact the Dispatch center by phone at 435-627-4949 and ask to obtain a burn permit. You must obtain the permit the day you intend to burn and it is good for that day only. It is important to remember that even with a burn permit you are responsible for any damage which results from your actions. To help you keep your burn activities under control and safe you should follow these guidelines:

- Burn in small piles about the size of a wheelbarrow. This will produce less smoke and flame and will be easier for you to control.
- Stay with your fire. Quick action can prevent fire spread. You can't act quickly if you are not there.
- Have a water source available. Water is our most readily available extinguishing agent. Have a hose nearby and charged with water.
- Don't burn near buildings, flammable fencing, power poles, vehicles, or other flammable objects.
- Don't burn when it is windy. Extinguish your fire if the wind increases. Wind usually increases and changes direction before thunder storms and ahead of cold fronts. Wind drastically affects the direction of travel and intensity of fire.
- Be sure your burn is extinguished before dark. Burning is only allowed during daylight hours. Fire appears more intense and nearer in the dark.
- Make sure your fire is completely extinguished before you leave it. Check it to insure that there are no remaining hotspots.
- Make sure that the weeds and clippings you are burning are dry and will burn readily. It is unlawful to create a nuisance by generating excess smoke while burning.

Keep in mind that the burn regulations allow for the burning of weeds, tree and bush limbs, leaves and other agricultural debris.

They do not allow you to burn trash, garbage, or construction debris.

We thank you for your efforts in keeping our city safe. How you handle a controlled burn can have a marked effect on the safety of your neighborhood. Please follow the guidelines listed above and have a safe burn season.

Power Flow Vinyasa - This is a class suited for those who have had some yoga experience and familiarity with a variety of yoga postures. Classes may include arm balances. All classes end with "*Savasana*", or a final resting posture. Gentle Yoga - This class is well-suited for beginners, and/or anyone desiring gentle and restorative yoga. You don't need to be "flexible" to take this class, but know that if you do begin a yoga practice, your body and mind will become more flexible and strong! This is a gentle-paced class which includes forward bends to calm the nervous system, standing postures, simple balance postures, seated postures, hip-openers, restorative postures, twists, and more. This class ends with "*Savasana*", or a

She also teaches modifications in each posture, so that each student feels able to practice each pose according to their own abilities. She fosters a non-competitive learning environment and encourage each student to work with what's available to their own body.
