The Ivins Reservoir Recreation Area and Nature Park

Recently discussions among representatives of Ivins City, the Washington County Water Conservancy District, the Shivwits Band of Paiute Indians and Ivins Irrigation Company lead to an agreed upon plan to further develop the Ivins Reservoir as a recreation area and nature park. Constructed nearly eighty years ago Ivins Reservoir is the oldest man made body of water in Washington County. Built as an irrigation storage facility it has served the needs of farmers in Ivins, Santa Clara and west St. George ever since.

Because it stores irrigation water the levels vary based on the year and the time of year. In times of drought like the period we're now in they remain low sometimes to the point of near empty by the end of the irrigation season. Yet despite that it has been a favorite fishing hole and recreation area from the beginning. I know residents who remember learning how to water ski there, a tricky undertaking given its size. It has also become home to waterfowl and other wildlife that can be seen there in varying numbers year round. Bird watching has become another favorite pastime there for some while others simply walk around it just to enjoy the beauty of the surroundings.

The reservoir was acquired by the Washington County Water Conservancy District and has been integrated into their regional system. The District owns most of the reservoir property except for a small strip on the west side that crosses onto the reservation. On August 18, 2000, Federal Legislation settled some water rights and reclamation issues with the Shivwits Band. Thereafter, agreements were approved by the Shivwits Band, Ivins City, the Washington County Water Conservancy District, St. George City and the irrigation and canal companies designating the reservoir as a multi-use facility with the primary purpose of facilitating the Santa Clara Project and the secondary purpose of recreation pursuant to an approved Ivins Reservoir Recreation Plan.

Since then intermittent discussions have taken place among the several parties to determine how best to develop the area. Issues under consideration included how to deal with the fluctuating water levels, how to preserve the reservoir as habitat for wildlife, how to protect the sensitive environment around it and what in the way of improvements would enhance it as a recreation area. I became involved three years ago and recognizing the reservoir's potential as a destination for our residents and visitors alike I encouraged the completion of an appropriate plan.

That was recently accomplished and the plan was presented for public comment on the 10th of November in a meeting held at the Ivins Veterans Home. Nearly a hundred interested individuals attended and several offered excellent suggestions. They were received in writing and are being summarized for review and inclusion before the formal agreement is presented to the Ivins City Council, the Shivwits Band Council, the WCWCD Board of Directors and the Board of the Irrigation Company for final approval.

The plan includes isolating the southwest three acre section of the reservoir by means of a causeway connecting two existing peninsulas that will allow the water level in the enclosed area to be controlled separately. By means of a piped inlet fresh water will flow continuously into the "cove" filling it to the desired level then cycle back into the main reservoir. This will allow the cove to remain usable through the entire recreation season except in extreme drought and hold

algae blooms and swimmers itch to a minimum. The cove will be surrounded by a sandy beach with a picnic area at one end of the causeway and concessions built by the Band that may include paddle boat, canoe and kayak rentals at the other end. Other amenities will include a paved & gated access road and parking area, a nature trail around the reservoir and restroom facilities. The Ivins Reservoir Recreation Area and Nature Park is proposed to become an Ivins City Park operated and maintained by the city and will be regularly patrolled by SCI law enforcement personnel. It is proposed to be a day use facility and in an effort to reasonably preserve the serenity of the area and show respect for nearby wildlife and residents restrictions prohibiting the use of alcohol, fires, motorized watercraft, loud music and dogs are also proposed. Lighting is intended to be nominal and down focused to preserve the night sky. Non-motorized watercraft or sailboards that can be carried or carted to the water's edge will be permitted but trailer launched boats no longer will be.



WCWCD is planning to empty and dredge the bottom of the reservoir this off season and construction of the causeway will commence immediately thereafter. Under the current plan WCWCD is providing the land for the park, the restroom facilities and may assist with some of the future development. The Shivwits Band is responsible for the concession area and to supply the sand to be used to construct the beachfront. Ivins City will provide the other amenities as well as long term maintenance and security. It is believed that there may be grants available to help defray the cost of improvements. It is also hoped that Eagle Scout projects and contributions by other civic organizations can be utilized to help build the rustic nature trail and provide other enhancements. 

Sprinkler System Winterization



The climate we live in generally produces winters with mild temperatures. However, we do on occasion experience periods of below freezing temperatures. These cold temperatures can easily freeze your sprinkler system if it is not shut off and/or winterized. Most vegetation goes dormant during the winter months and doesn't require water. If it does, watering occasionally using a garden hose or bucket will usually be sufficient. To avoid costly sprinkler system repairs, high water use/waste, and a fifty-dollar after-hours/weekend emergency shut off fee, be sure to shut your system off, especially when cold weather is imminent.

- Do not overload electrical outlets with holiday lights.
- Use safety-tested lights and extension cords that carry the "UL" label.

Put these energy efficiency tips on your list and have a wattsmart holiday time:

- Cook by time and temperature – precise timing eliminates repeated opening of the oven door. Each time it's opened, the temperature can drop 25° - 50°F.

and last up to 10 times longer. ENERGY STAR® bulbs come with a three-year warranty.

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! With the holiday season upon us we should also remember our pets during this time of the year. Lots of people like to get puppies and kittens for Christmas. Having a new pet is always fun, but especially during the holidays there are many things you should keep in mind.



If you decide to adopt a pet it's always better to do it a few weeks before Christmas. Christmas is such a hectic time that a new cat or dog needs some time to quietly settle into the family. Our houses are full of festive food and drinks; however, these can be harmful to our pets. We should also be mindful that a new puppy or kitten needs a quiet, safe place that they can rest in after an exhausting play period. Crates are a great way to provide a place for them away from the active children. Dogs and cats don't know what is harmful to them so they play and sometimes eat them.

Here are a few of the more common things to look out for as always, if your concerned in any way, don't delay in calling your vet.

1. Raisins and grapes can cause renal failure.
2. Chocolate, especially dark types. Remember dogs can smell chocolate thru wrapping.
3. Onions and garlic contain a toxin that can destroy red blood cells (both are in stuffing).
4. Turkey bones can puncture the stomach or intestine.
5. Macadamia nuts or nuts in general can elevate heart rates to an unsafe level.
6. Other items include: tinsel, bows, light strands, plastic toys.

The shelter now has a completed shelving to house all of our dog and cat crates that we need at our shelter for transport of our animals. Thanks to our Eagle scout project!

INKAS- Ivins No-Kill Animal Supporters Barbara Rusick, Director/Treasurer

Keeping the Animals Adoptable and the Shelter in Good Repair are important goals of INKAS. To the goal of “keeping the animals adoptable”, we are funding a pilot training program for Ivins Shelter dogs aimed at certifying them as Canine Good Citizens. We will start with two dogs and two volunteer handlers who will attend six weekly classes at WOOF, LLC at a cost of \$155 each. Shelter Manager, Aggie Smith, requested that we initiate this program, and we are pleased to comply. We'll keep you posted on results.

To the goal of “keeping the shelter in good repair”, INKAS is currently in the process of replacing all the worn-out guillotine doors in the shelter dog kennels. Professional kennel-quality doors will be purchased and installed. The cost of this project is currently estimated at \$5,000.

Last, we are very pleased to report that a new Volunteer Associate has joined our INKAS family of hard working animal lovers. She is Phyllis Pusczek of St. George. This brings our number to twelve.

Holiday Safety

As the holiday season is now upon us, many seasonal projects are started and decorations and lights are placed around the home. As people are in the hustle to decorate their homes, this is a leading cause of slip and fall injuries.

Use care when using a ladder to place lights and decorations around your home. Never over reach, and have a good solid foundation when placing your ladder. It is also helpful to have someone heel your ladder as you climb. If you are on your roof, use care as you walk around as there may be slippery and sometimes frosty or icy spots in the shade or after cold or wet weather. Uneven surfaces can cause a slip or fall which can cause you to lose footing and end up injured.

Use care this holiday season with your Christmas tree. If you have a natural tree, keep it watered. Dry trees are a fire danger. Keep water in the stand and water daily. Make sure your lights are not worn or broken. Do not connect more than the manufacturers recommended number of lights together. Make sure your electrical connection is not overloaded. Keep all candles and heat sources at least three feet away from your tree. Never use lit candles to decorate the tree!

A few facts about holiday fires:

- One of every three home fires is caused by electrical failures.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur they are more likely to be serious.
- Nearly half of holiday decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.
